Safeguarding

- Students are registered every morning in their tutor group. A register is also taken in every lesson throughout the day.
- If a child arrives late to school or has to leave early, for whatever reason, they must come through Reception and sign in or out.
- Similarly all visitors to the school must sign in and out at Reception and wear a visitor ID badge while on site. They will also be accompanied by a member of staff.







Illness

- If your child is ill, please phone the school before 8.30am and leave a message on the answerphone.
- If your child becomes ill during the day, they will be assessed by a member of our support staff and you may be contacted to collect them.







Bullying



- Incidents of bullying at Netherhall are rare, but are taken seriously.
- We have a strong anti-bullying policy.
- Any incidents are dealt with quickly.
- We can only act when students tell us what is going on.




The NABC (Netherhall Anti-Bullying Community) is a student led group who promote a positive ethos throughout the school and support any students who are feeling vulnerable.
