Bullying

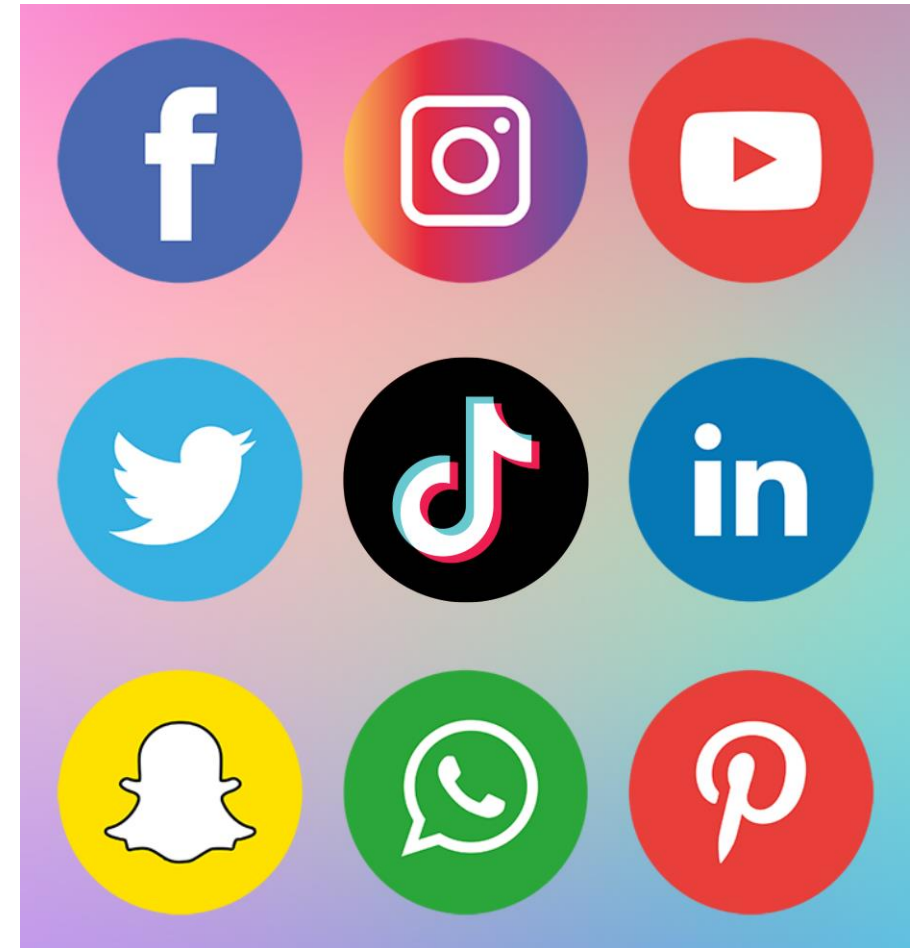
- Incidents of bullying at Netherhall are rare, but are taken seriously.



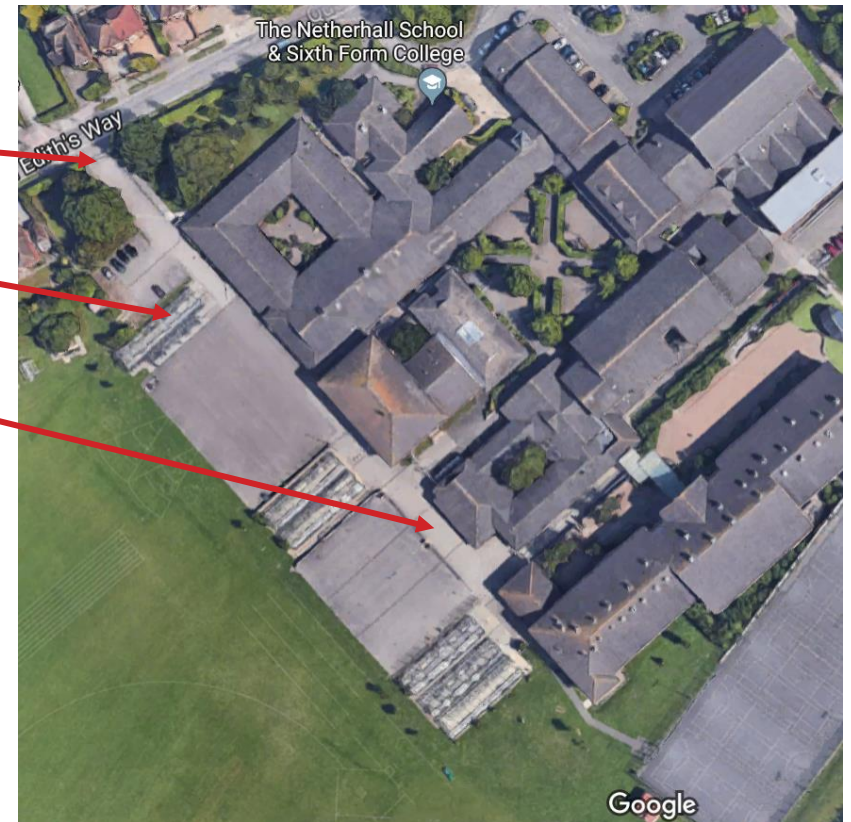
- The Netherhall School operates a cashless payment system, and we know you will appreciate the many benefits this system brings to students and parents.
