A-level

Component 1: Poetry and Prose

You will study an anthology of poetry, together with a prose fiction text such as 'Jane Eyre', 'Atonement' or 'The Color Purple'.

Assessment: One two hour open-book (clean copies) exam. One section will focus on analysis and comparison of poems from the anthology and the other will focus on the set prose text. There will be one question on each section. (30%)

Component 2: Drama

You will study one Shakespeare play such as 'Othello', 'Much Ado About Nothing' or 'The Tempest'. You will also study one post-1900 drama text such as 'Kindertransport' or 'Cat on a Hot Tin Roof'

Assessment: One two-hour exam with one section on the Shakespeare play and another section on the post-1900 drama text. There will be an extract question on the Shakespeare play and a choice of essay-style questions on both texts. (30%)

Component 3: Non-Literary Texts

For this unit you will prepare by studying a range of short non-fiction texts, including transcripts of real-life conversations. You will be looking at how bias, prejudice, attitudes and values are conveyed through language. You will also study one non-literary text, such as 'In Cold Blood'.

Assessment: One two-hour exam in which you first analyse and compare three unseen spoken language and non-literary texts and then answer a two-part question on your set non-literary text. (20%)

Component 4: Non-Exam Assessment

You will study a prose genre such as science fiction, journalism, crime fiction or travel writing. You will then use your reading to help inspire some creative writing in this genre.

Assessment: One 1500-word genre study of a prose text and related wider reading. Two further pieces of related creative writing – one literary and one non-literary (approximately 1000 words each) – one relating to the genre studied for the first piece. (20%)
