- 1. **Philosophy & Ethics** Topics studied include religious experiences, arguments for and against the existence of God, ethical theories and issues of life and death.

Assessment

100% examination

Students will be expected to sit only internal exams at the end of year 1 and the whole A-level grade will be based on the exams sat at the end of year 2.

Whilst the content of this subject at A-level is stimulating in its own right, the skills developed are varied and important.

Teaching methods include questions, discussion, group work, presentations, listening to radio programmes, watching videos, and reading articles.

The Staff

There are three members of staff in the department who currently teach A-level Religion, Philosophy and Ethics. This is important because it means you will have at least two fully qualified teachers, not just one, for your A-level who can offer more support and guidance.

The Resources

The department is well stocked. We have text books and revision guides which we lend out to students so that you do not have to purchase texts – although it is necessary to purchase texts if you would like to annotate your copy. In addition to this, we supply revision worksheets and mind maps to assist with revision.

Also, we can supply additional textbooks which cover the content for both years of the course if students request them or need them; in that case we would make them available. These texts are AQA approved and outline the key ideas being covered on the course in a more concise and accessible format.

The Opportunities

We offer students the opportunity to attend conferences dedicated to A-level Religion, Philosophy and Ethics, this enables them to hear excellent speakers in this field.
